Our member group with specialist knowledge relating to community concerns in the Cheltenham/Woodville areas, the Cheltenham Park Residents Association (CPRA), has advised the Community Alliance SA regarding the public consultation underway on the proposal to alter the boundaries of places in the Woodville and Cheltenham Park Racecourse areas, and we present the following comments for your consideration.

1. That the existing suburb of Woodville terminate at Actil Avenue ie. to contain additionally all the land bounded by Torrens Road and the Adelaide / Outer Harbor train line beyond Woodville Road.
2. A new suburb named Cheltenham Park be created within the boundaries of the Adelaide / Outer Harbor train line, Cheltenham Parade, Torrens Road and Actil Avenue.

Please note that:

1. above retains all present Woodville residences in that suburb, including the historic Woodville High School, first established as the Woodville District High School, opened in 1915. We are advised that Woodville High School is an internationally accredited Student address for overseas enrolments.

Of historic significance to the Woodville community is Glenys Nunn Drive that connects Woodville Road with Actil Avenue. This naming honors the achievement of Glenys Nunn in receiving the Gold Medal for the heptathlon at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

Glenys Nunn Drive Woodville has International Olympic Committee acknowledgement in ceremonial literature.

The nomination 2. above retains the historic name of Cheltenham Park for an area recognized nationally by that name since the start of horse racing there in 1895 by the Port Adelaide Racing Club and historically related to extensive military and aviation heritage as well as thoroughbred horse racing and other equestrian events.

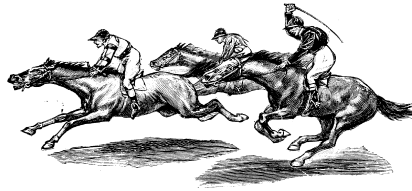
Please further note that:

1. and 2. leave the name St Clair unconfused for the St Clair Recreation Centre and the locality of playing fields and recreation parks with long term association with Woodville and Woodville Road.
