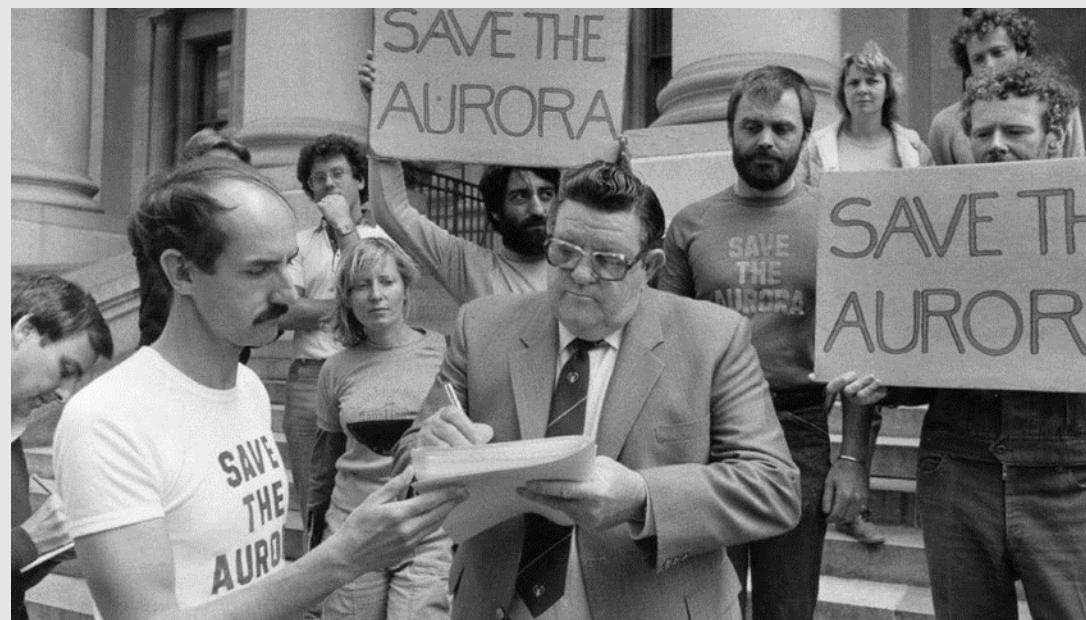

More heritage demolitions



More cheap knock ups



40 years of heritage protection is at risk

- 38 local government areas have heritage lists (30 do not)
- 2 290 State Heritage places
- 7 058 Local Heritage places
- 11 965 Contributory items
- Historic conservation zones
- 17 State Heritage areas

What we need to happen

- Prohibition on any demolition of listed heritage places (including contributory items)
- Protection of new heritage conservation zones
- Independent statutory body to assess new heritage listings.
- Bringing all heritage identification and management under one Act.
- Genuine community engagement on planning laws

What you can do

- Find out what is at risk in your suburb or area
- Write to your local MP seeking protection for all heritage places
- Inform your community- public meetings, notices, local newspapers
